The tone in the beginning was very uplifting, however there came a point when the band slowed down the music and the woman singing started speaking really softly and telling the crowd uplifting words, for example at one point she kept mentioning that God loves us, and that he's a merciful God. After a few more minutes of open prayer, the pastor transitioned into his actual sermon and started talking about tithes and offerings. This next section of the service was more predictable, because Pastor Tony Addinall started speaking scriptures that were in the Bible about how important sowing a small seed is. I really enjoyed that Pastor Tony Addinall spoke very bold and very sure in everything. He seemed determined and really could transfer that energy onto the audience.
