Understanding what an agency does and their priorities

- Study websites of agencies that may have an interest in your research/idea
- Know priorities and what they fund
- Get to know people in the agency in your area of expertise/interest
- Go to meetings and workshops
- Volunteer for committees and workgroups to share your expertise



Steps to developing a project

- Refine how your proposed project will contribute to the mission of the agency that matches your expertise
- Familiarize yourself with development resources available through OSP
- Prepare an outline of your proposal
- Meet with staff members who will champion your project
- Determine if funding is available
- Scale your project to meet funding availability



Steps to developing a project

- Determine the agency process for submitting a materials for an agreement
 - Scope of work
 - Deliverables
 - Budget
 - Agency template
- Work through your school/department to contact and coordinate with OSP
- Understand the guidance from OSP (what is required by VCU for the agreement to be approved)
