- Some of the services I provided were listening, small talk, help with vocabulary, correcting grammar, providing insight into American culture, and helping with their lessons

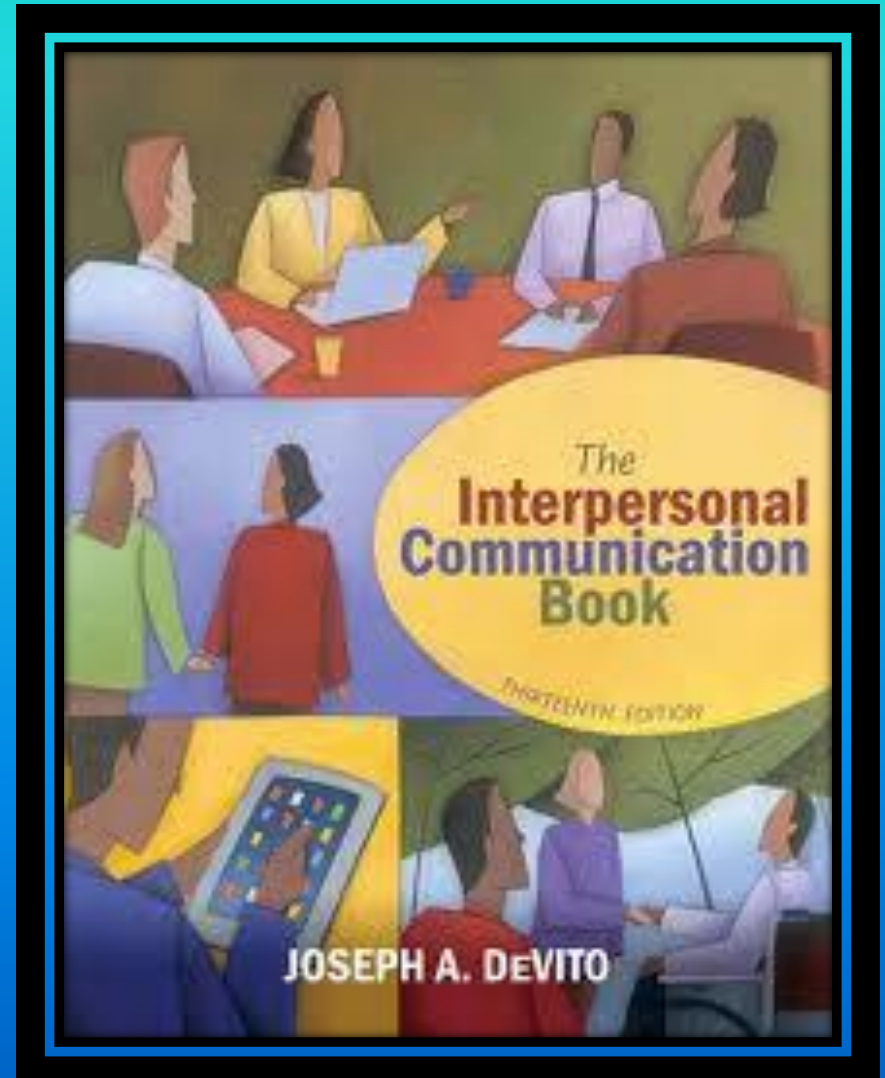
Positive Influences Made
