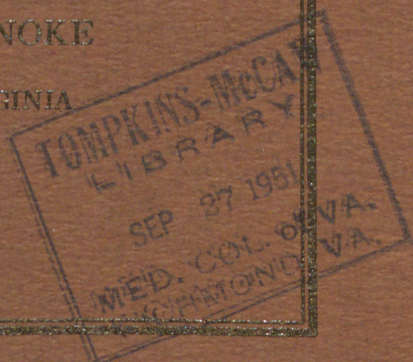

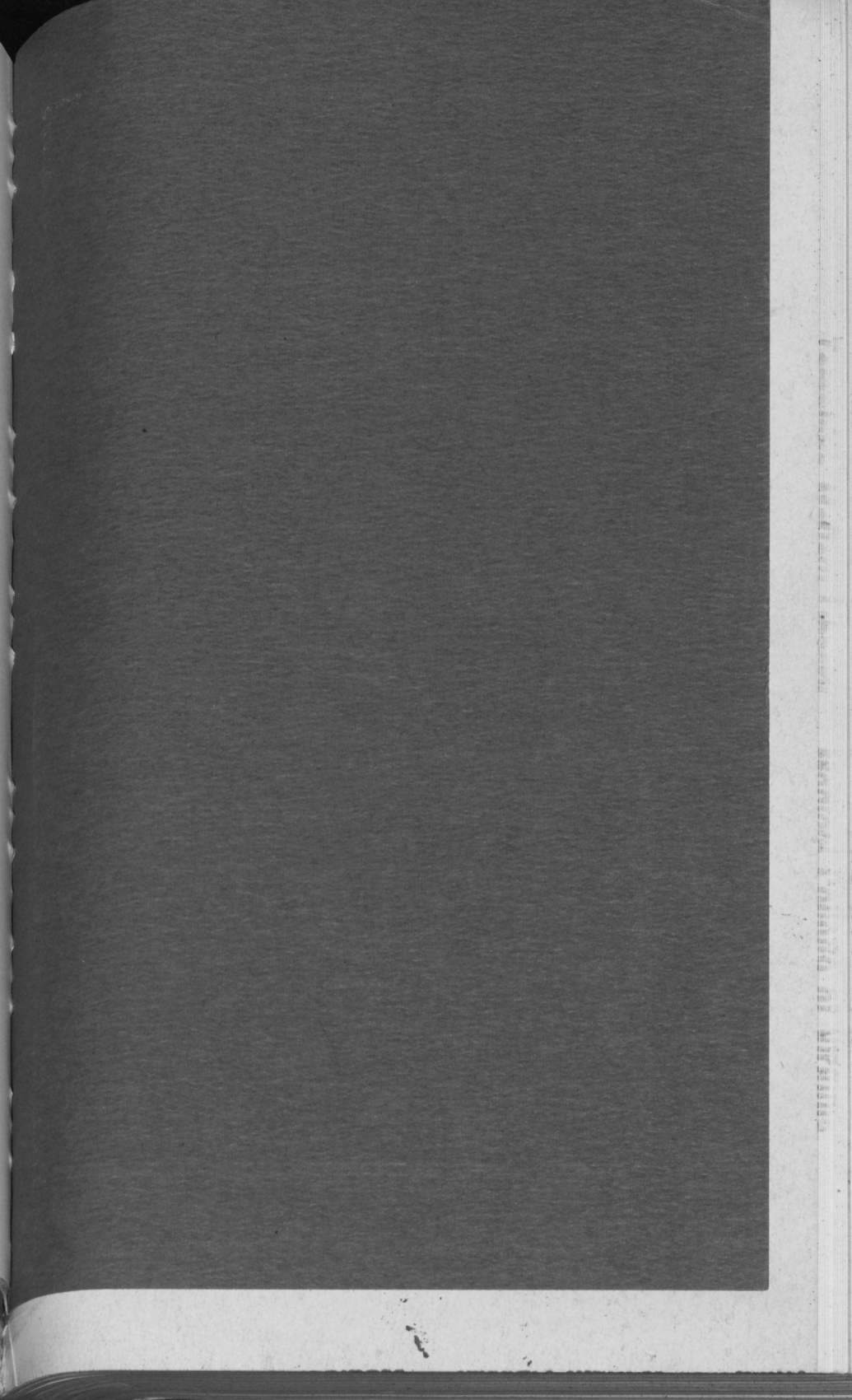

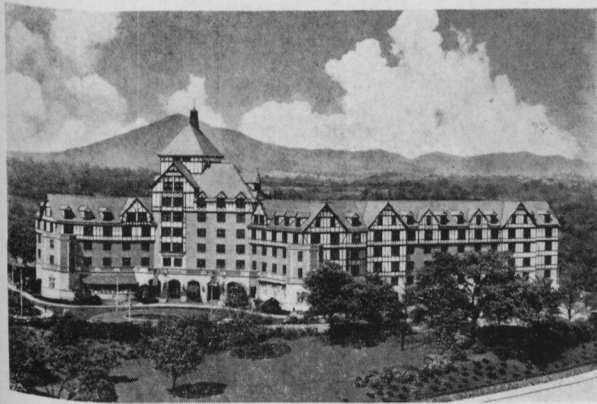

"The Past Year in Dental Research."

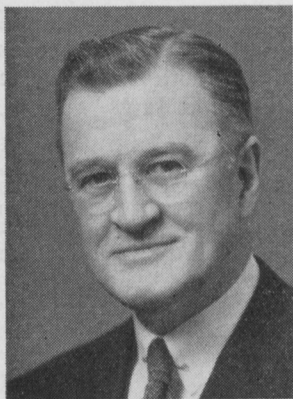

Synopsis :

How to meet the usual problems encountered in everyday practice will be presented. Since roentgen-ray effort is the chief source of information leading to a diagnosis, the information must be dependable. This implies the proper use of the machine as well as accurate reading of the finished film.

"Manifestations in Dental Practice of Metabolic and Endocrine Disorders."

JEROME W. CONN, M.D., Associate Professor of Internal Medicine and Chief of Metabolism and Endocrinology, University of Michigan Medical School, Ann Arbor, Mich.

Synopsis :

Disorders of metabolism and diseases of the endocrine glands, while usually affecting functions of the whole body, frequently exhibit recognizable manifestations in the mouth. Thus, the practicing dentist can often be the first to detect such abnormalities. Oral manifestations are observable as the result of imperfect function of the pituitary, the thyroid, the parathyroids and the adrenal glands. These problems will be discussed in detail.
