Project Description

We feel there is a need for opportunities for clinical and administrative faculties to connect with students in a way that can fit into the very busy schedules of both students and faculty/staff. Our plan is to use the Student Portal currently being developed by the Office of Academic Technology. There, one click would connect students to faculty/staff profiles where the student could query topics of interest and then email selected faculty and staff. To start the process, volunteer faculty and staff would create a profile of their professional and personal interests. The student would access this database through a key-word search of the faculty/staff profiles. This project fits in well the following VCU goals and initiatives: Student Centered University, connections between the two campuses, and increased student, staff, and faculty retention.

Project Goals

- 1. Give faculty and staff opportunities to connect with students outside their department.
- 2. Give students a sense of belonging to the larger VCU and Richmond community
- 3. Assist students with day-to-day personal and academic challenges

Strategies:

- Bring together student service and technology administrators who would have a stake in the project.
- Keep it Simple for sustainability and development
- Make it digital a communication preference of the Millennium Generation

Action Steps:

- 1. Conducted informal student interest survey, both campuses, to find out areas of interest and potential use.
- 2. Consulted with VCU Web services about different technical models.
- 3. Informally consulted with Associate Dean for Undergraduate Programs, Jon Steingass.
- 4. Consulted with Sue Anne Messmer, who offered the web design services of Creative Services.
- 5. Brainstormed on categories to include in the database.
- 6. Discussed and determined strategies to respect faculty time constraints for participation, such as log off, email only contact, etc.

Outcomes

- Attempted to have a meeting of the following stake holders, but the meeting was impossible to fit into schedules.
- Potential Name: VCU Connections, VCUmmunity
- Sample database and interface screens

Recommendations

- Our project should be incorporated into the VCU Portal.
- We feel that the service should be administered by Student Affairs, First Year Student Services; Office of Undergraduate Advising of the College of Humanities and Sciences; or VCU Web Services.
- Start small, with faculty and staff of College of Humanities and Sciences and Grace Harris Leadership Alumni. Promote to first year students.
