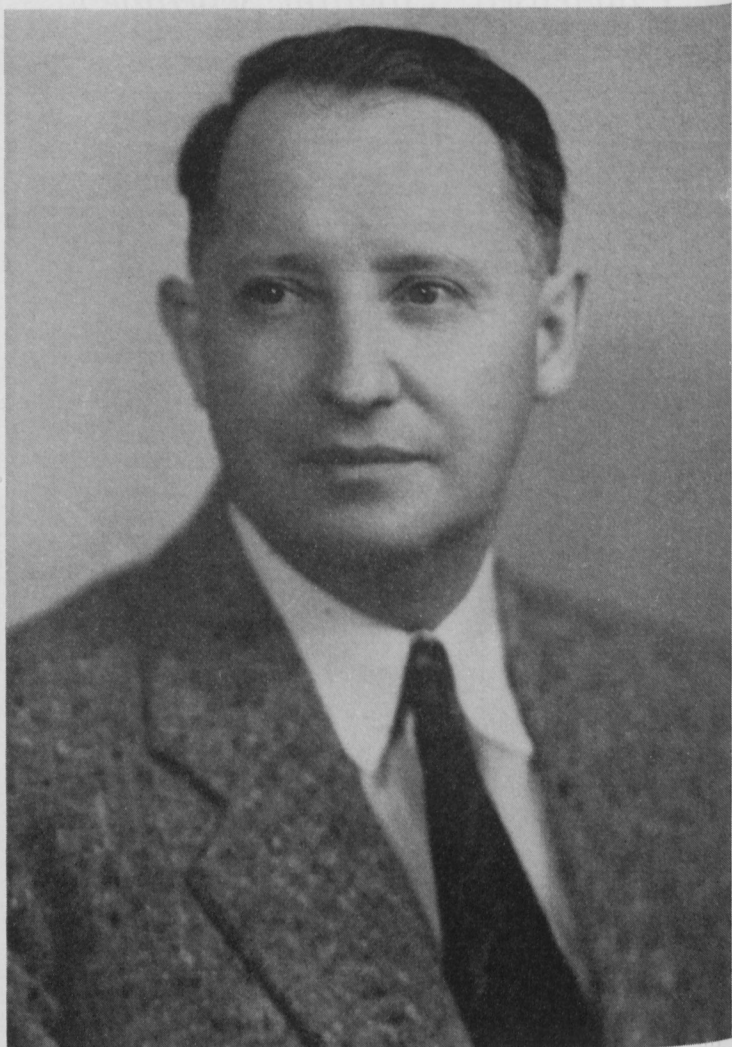

## Paper on "The Porcelain Jacket Crown"

By H. D. GRUBB, D.D.S.,

Past President American Academy of Restorative Dentistry, Cleveland, Ohio

*Synopsis:* A discussion of the physiological and mechanical problems of porcelain jacket crown construction will be offered. Particular attention will be given to the application of the elemental principles of mechanics in making preparations which will provide the maximum of support for the porcelain. Illustrated by lantern slides. A clinic will be presented on "Bridge-work" with a demonstration by means of lantern slides and models. Subjects

such as preparations and attachments, wax patterns by the direct method, bridgework employed in a case of occlusal reconstruction and the technic employed in coordinating the occlusion will be discussed.

*Synopsis:* A discussion illustrated with lantern slides in which some reference will be made to etiology, symptomatology, diagnosis, prognosis, and treatment of certain pathological conditions about the mouth, maxillae, mandible, and neck observed in a consulting and surgical practice. Case discussion of some acute infections, congenital and acquired deformities, injuries, and neoplastic processes will be presented.

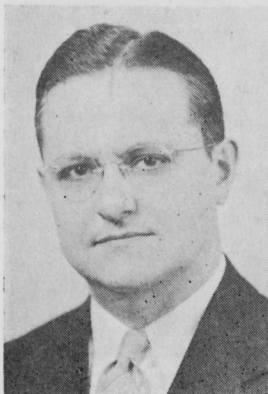




## **"The Present Status of the Problem of Dental Caries"**

## **"Occlusion In Artificial Dentures"**

of Prosthetics at Georgetown Uni-

*Synopsis:* This illustrated lecture will deal with such questions as:

What constitutes a good occlusion in artificial dentures?

Why should the occlusion of artificial dentures be different from that of natural teeth?

Assuming that an ideal occlusion has been established, how long will it last?

Locked occlusions are detrimental to denture stability. How may they be avoided?

What areas on which teeth should make contact when the jaws are closed in various relations?

How does ridge resorption effect the occlusion?



## **"Root Canal Therapy"**

By ROBERT G. KESEL, D.D.S.,  
Professor of Dental Pathology, College  
of Dentistry, University of  
Illinois, Chicago, Ill.

*Synopsis:* The rationale for the type of root canal therapy employed at the University of Illinois will be discussed following a brief analysis of the histories of over 8,000 pulp involved teeth treated in the dental clinic since 1918. A motion picture in Kodachrome will be shown to illustrate the technic used for the removal of a vital pulp

from an upper first bicuspid and the subsequent treatment and filling of the root canals. A clinic will be presented discussing the selection of patients and of teeth for treatment and will further demonstrate technic, including instrumentation, medication and filling.

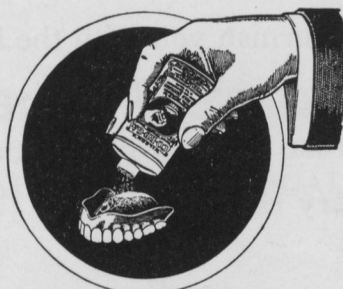

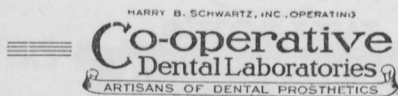

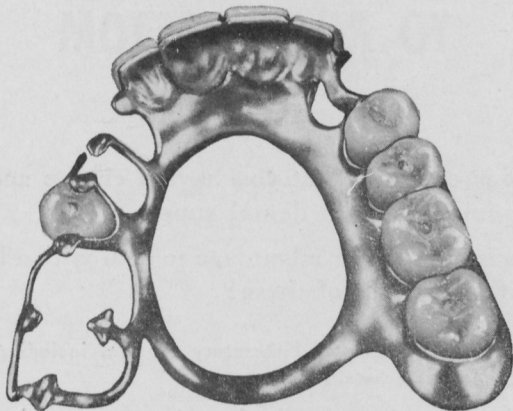
