*Synopsis*

*The Use and Misuse of the Toothbrush in the Prevention  
and Treatment of Periodontal Disease*

The brush properly employed is civilizations challenge to two of the most common ills fostered by it (civilization); namely, dental caries and periodontoclasia. While science is still striving to ascertain the etiology of these human ills, the toothbrush has been proven to be a most potent direct means for the prevention of both. As an aid in the treatment of different types of periodontal disease, and in the successful maintenance of post-operative health, it is the most reliable agency at our command.

However, improperly employed, the toothbrush can produce no end of abnormal, or pathologic sequelae, most frequently unnoticed, undiagnosed and uncorrected. Its haphazard use, while producing a measure of local good, may permit disease in parts not properly reached, to develop to a point of negative prognosis.

Thus it is obvious that the dental practitioner, to keep at par, must have an intimate knowledge of the potentialities (good and bad) of the toothbrush and its manner of use.
