The play will be staged by Raymond Hodges, Associate Professor of Dramatic Art. In the cast are Margaret Page of Rocky Mount, N. C.; Betsy Williams of Richlands, Va.; Christine Taylor of Richmond; James Maloney of New Britain, Conn.; Theodore Turner of Frederick Hall, Va.; and Robert Watkins of Richmond.

Dela Tazewell, who has been serving as Assistant to the Director, will stage manage the production. Ann Morgan is in charge of properties. The list of properties is long and varied and shows what a vital part of the

play they are. Assisting Miss Morgan will be Dorothea Mills and Audrey Schriber.

Mary Frances Rutherford will serve as wardrobe mistress for the production. The make-up committee consists of Virginia O'Connor, Tat West and Nancy Parsons. Dela Tazewell, Frances Danto, Marian Starts, Mary Rutherford, Ann Morgan, Darrell Landrum and Robert Watkins have been, at various times, on the set crew.

The panelling was laid out by members of the Interior Decoration classes under the supervision of Dorothy Tennent. Mr. W. H. Tolerton served as advisor on the set which was designed by Robert Watkins.

Anita Liebowitz will be house manager for the production. Students and Faculty are admitted free; all others sixty-five cents. Tickets may be had at the door. The play will be given this evening and tomorrow evening at eight-fifteen o'clock.

### W. & M. Has 250th Anniversary

Exercises Held In  
Williamsburg On February 8

William and Mary, "mother college" of the Richmond Professional Institute, started its two hundred and fifty-first year of service after a celebration on Monday, February 8, that marked the anniversary.

In a simple ceremony, Dr. John E. Pomfret was formally installed as the twenty-first president of William and Mary, and at the same time, John Stewart Bryan was inaugurated as the fourth chancellor of the school. Mr. Bryan is a Richmond publisher and retired president of William and Mary.

Dr. Pomfret said at the exercises that "colleges and universities are conservative, long-lived institutions, clinging stubbornly to methods and practices that have stood the test of time.

Dr. Pomfret has actually been presiding over William and Mary since last September, after Mr. Bryan, who had held the position for eight years, retired. In order to honor Mr. Bryan for his work, he was made chancellor, a position held previously by only three men.
