CONCERNING THE SCIENTIFIC PROGRAM

To the Membership:

When the task of staging the scientific program for the next annual meeting of the Virginia State Dental Association was assigned to us by the Association's officers, we accepted the assignment with enthusiastic pleasure for several reasons.

Primarily, we have a few pet notions regarding the type of program we should like to have for our annual meeting. Fashions change in scientific programs as they do in other projects. We trust that you will find the new trends in your program this year stimulating. Similar types of programs have been well received elsewhere.

This year's meeting will commemorate the 100th anniversary of organized Dentistry in Virginia. This celebration is truly significant in many respects. The events of the past will be suitably memorialized by several speakers of note. The trend of Dentistry in the future will be prophesied by several men now guiding Dentistry's destiny. Reference to them will appear elsewhere. In keeping with the significance and dignity of this centenary celebration, we have arranged a scientific program which we have every reason to believe will be a milestone in the Association's educational efforts. The essayists and clinicians are top-ranking members of their respective fields. They are veteran and authoritative clinicians whom we have heard elsewhere and admired. Consequently, we are able to speak with certainty of their professional qualities.

The program is scheduled to be a very full and intensive study of several phases of dental practice. *Three full days* of practical instruction await you. Starting early Monday morning, April 6, and extending thru Wednesday afternoon, April 8, you will have an opportunity to enjoy an intensive refresher course. "Acrylic Resins for Dentures and Inlays."

DENTAL PREPAREDNESS QUESTIONNAIRE

Since the treacherous action of the Japanese on Sunday, December 7, 1941, the matter of the Preparedness Questionnaire has assumed added importance. On December 1, 1941, only 75% of American dentists who received these questionnaires had responded. Immediately following the attack on Pearl Harbor Doctor Gerald A. Timmons, Executive Secretary of the American Dental Association and Secretary to the Dental Preparedness Committee, went into action with a new plan to secure the delinquent questionnaires. The plan was to immediately begin a remailing of questionnaires to those who failed to respond to the first call.

Much work of tabulation will have to be done even after all replies are in the hands of the Committee. America is now at war and the matter is urgent. It is to be hoped that by this date all replies from Virginia will have been returned to the American Dental Association at 212 East Superior Street, Chicago, Illinois.

ANOTHER ROLE FOR DENTISTS IN THE FIGHT FOR FREEDOM

- THE DEFENSE SAVINGS PROGRAM -

America today is the great hope for freedom in a war torn world. We can only make this hope come true by immediate and universal service and sacrifice.

This must come from us in our profession as dentists, and in our lot as private citizens. We shall postpone the satisfaction of many of our normal needs and wants to help the Nation win. We shall lend our money to the Government to pay for the tools of war.

The Nation has pledged more than half of its efforts for Victory. We seek to build this year 60,000 planes, 45,000 tanks, and similar enormous quantities of other war material. This will call for more than \$56,000,000,000.

The dollars can come only from the people. Although our taxes will undoubtedly mount drastically, a new tax program cannot nor should not be relied upon to meet the total cost of our Victory Program. Some of the deficit can and will be met by borrowing from banks and private lending organizations, but the First World War taught us the dangers of credit inflation.

Because neither taxes nor borrowing can be relied upon to meet the mounting bill, the Treasury Department is turning directly to the people of the United States to invest their Savings in Defense Bonds and Stamps. By so doing, Americans may help to build both *National* and *Personal* security. In the first place, the money invested in Bonds and Stamps will buy planes, tanks, ships, and guns.

For the individual, bonds represent personal reserves of cash, just as good as cash in the bank. No one knows what the future will bring, but the chances are that the wartime boom in wages, income, and prices will be followed by a post-war slump. By buying Defense Bonds regularly out of current earnings, Americans can build themselves a "backlog" against a possible reduction in income, sickness or other emergencies. Regular, systematic Bond purchase, which is the aim of the Defense Savings Program, is also a good way to provide educational funds for children or to make a provision for old age.

While helping to protect investors against a possible future reduction in income, Defense Savings Bonds help protect the buyer against inflation now. One of the main ways to halt price rises is to reduce the amount of money in the hands of consumers. Rather than do this by compulsory methods, the Government has chosen to do it through the voluntary Defense Savings Program. This is the Democratic Way.

The Series E Bonds are called "The People's Bonds." They can be bought only by individuals. The smallest costs \$18.75, and pays \$25 at maturity in 10 years. Others cost from \$37.50 (\$50 maturity value) to \$750 (\$1,000 maturity value). The People's Bonds are registered in the names of one or two owners or in the name of one person with a second listed as beneficiary. They are non-transferable and cannot, therefore, fluctuate in value, but they may be redeemed by the owners any time after 60 days from the date of issue if the money is needed. They can be purchased at any post office and at almost any bank.

Series F Bonds, unlike the Series E Bonds, may be purchased by associations. And there are now new small denomination Series F Bonds. These are the twelve-year \$25 Bonds which cost \$18.50. Like the Series E Bonds, they are redeemable before maturity, at the option of the owners. Although Bonds of Defense Series F are issued only by Federal Reserve Banks and the Treasury Department, commercial banks generally will handle applications for them.

These are the bonds for individuals and for groups designed to fit all sizes of pocketbooks. Secretary Morgenthau has set the goal: "This is not a token war. It is not a two per cent war. It is not a war that can be won with spare change. Each of us will have to figure out the very most that we can set aside to buy Defense Bonds, for our own good and for our country's good, as long as the war may last."

RELIEF FUND SEALS

Every member of the profession in Virginia by now has received from the A. D. A. his Relief Fund Seals and many have already made returns; may we remind those who have not yet contributed, to remember the obligation and the privilege that is ours in helping our worthy but unfortunate members at a time when the spirit of giving is with us, and how little it will cost us to insure for them, when they need it, a New Happiness and a New Confidence in their fellow men.

The A. D. A. has inaugurated a new system on the Relief Fund Seals whereby every two weeks a report is sent to the Chairman of the local Relief Committees giving the amounts received during that period from members.

The first report, dated December 8th, has just been received and it lists the names of 170 of our members, who have contributed \$208.50 so far; these contributions run from \$1.00 to \$5.00 for these seals and it is a splendid beginning, let's keep up the good work.

Locations for Dentists

A need for additional dentists exists in many of the vital defense areas. These shortages have arisen because of the great increases in civilian population which have occurred during the year. At present, needs exist in a number of States in communities varying in size from small villages to large cities. A continuing increase in population will result in overtaxing the dental personnel in many other localities where at present the dentists are very near the limit of their capacities.

In many of these defense areas there are Defense Housing Projects in which office space or living accommodations, or both, may be secured. The United States Public Health Service in cooperation with the Division of Defense Housing of the Federal Works Agency, which supervises these projects, is interested in acquainting dentists with the needs of these communities. If you are interested in securing more specific information about localities for the establishment of practice, please communicate with me.

History of a Century Ago

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE DENTAL PROFESSION IN VIRGINIA

Gentlemen:

The undersigned, a committee appointed by "The Virginia Society of Surgeon Dentists," respectfully request permission to call your attention to the organization of that Society, and ask your co-operation in the furtherance of its views for the advancement of the interests of the profession in our State.

With us you have no doubt long mourned the various evils under which dental surgery has labored, occasioned by the lack of some common centre, from which should radiate the elements of a sound Dental Education, or the means of detecting quackery and charlatan-ism, and stamping upon merit the evidence of proper application to the roles of our art.

This long night was at length broken by the institution of "The American Society of Dental Surgeons." To this succeeded the Baltimore College of Dental Surgery, an institution which should receive the fostering care and support of every member of our profession. These have already done much for our art in furnishing a bond of union to those who prefer honest fame to gold and establishing a sound system of professional education. Last, but not least, the Virginia Society has entered the arena, to accomplish in our own State what has been so successfully effected north of us. What it is this last Society desires to effect will be seen by reference to the accompanying Constitution and By-Laws. Too long has our favorite science been considered a mere mechanical trade, into which every unprepared quack, acquainted with the use of small tools, might obtrude himself at pleasure. Men of high attainments in other branches of the healing art have lent themselves to this delusion, and greatly contributed to the injury of a science that ranks deservedly high, when well understood and practiced, and aids in effecting as much for the relief of human suffering as any one branch of the healing art. It is time that the virtue and intelligence of the profession in Virginia should unite to root away its reproaches, and erect a standard of qualification which will place Dental Surgery where

it should be, alongside its sister sciences; Medicine and General Surgery.

The Virginia Society aims to effect in this State a consummation so desired and devoutly wished for by us all; this it hopes to do by a rigid adherence to the requisites for membership in its body, and thus unite all who respect their profession, in an effort to protect it from the unhallowed hands of the ignorant and pretending, as well as secure that professional unity and courtesy, which is so essential to the improvement and elevation of the science.

With these views to govern our undertaking, we call to our aid our professional brethren; those who may wish to unite with us will please forward their applications to the Examining Committee, or any one of them, and give us their attendance at the next annual meeting to be held in the city of Richmond the second Wednesday in October next.

VIRGINIA SOCIETY OF SURGEON DENTISTS

CONSTITUTION

Preamble

Whereas, the abuses, the flagrant malpractices perpetrated by individuals engaged in the practice of "Dental Surgery", have long been sources of unmitigated obloquy and contempt—visited alike upon the scientific and upright practitioner of our art, and the "gasconading charlatan"; and conceiving that the abuses in question may be partially, if not wholly corrected; that the imposture which has long degraded the dental profession in Virginia, may to a considerable extent, be suppressed—the interest of the science promoted, its character elevated, and a free and open interchange of sentiment and opinion, upon the various subjects of interest which appertain to our profession, be established; we whose names are hereunto affixed, have organized ourselves into a Society, which shall be known and designated by the name and title of "THE VIRGINIA SOCIETY OF SURGEON DENTISTS".

ARTICLE I.—*Of Officers*

SECTION 1. The officers of his Society shall consist of a President and Vice-President, a Recording and Corresponding Secretary, an Executive, Examining and Publishing Committee.

SEC. 2. The election of the above named officers shall be by ballot, at a regular annual meeting of the Society, a majority of votes determining the election.

ARTICLE II.—*Of Members*

There shall be two classes of members, known and recognized as Acting Members or Fellows, and Honorary Members; the former consisting of those

who subscribe to this constitution, either personally or by proxy, and pay into the treasury the annual dues required by this constitution, and the latter embracing such members as are merely elected to membership.

ARTICLE III.—*Requisitions for Membership*

SEC. 1. Each and every acting member of this Society, shall have been such by virtue of his attendance in person, by proxy, or letter, at the time of its formation, or shall afterwards be elected as prescribed by this constitution, and subscribe to the same.

SEC. 2. Each and every acting member shall pay into the treasury of the Society, the annual sum of three dollars, for the benefit of its funds.

SEC. 3. Each and every acting member shall be required to attend the Society at least once in two years, unless excused for satisfactory reasons.

ARTICLE IV.—*Election of Members*

All members of the Society, excepting those who were acting members, at the time of its organization, and the adoption of this constitution, shall be elected as follows, viz.: The candidate for membership shall be proposed at a regular meeting by the Executive Committee, whereupon two tellers shall be appointed by the presiding officer, who shall collect the ballots, consisting of slips of paper, having legibly written on them either yea or nay. In case two-thirds of the members present vote in the affirmative, the candidate shall be declared to have been duly elected a member of this Society.

ARTICLE V.—*Expulsion of Members*

Any member of the Society may be expelled for immoral conduct, malpractice or other sufficient cause, on motion of one member, seconded by another, and sustained by a majority of two-thirds of the members present, at any regular meeting of the Society.

ARTICLE VI.—*Of Meetings of the Society*

The meetings of the Society shall be held annually by adjournment from time to time, and from place to place, agreeably to the will of the Society.

ARTICLE VII.—*Of the Resources of the Society*

SECTION 1. This Society may receive contributions of money, books, or other property, which may be either sold in aid of its purposes, or otherwise used.

SEC. 2. Each and every candidate examined and admitted to membership, shall pay into the treasury a fee of five dollars, before receiving his Diploma or certificate.

SEC. 3. Each and every honorary member, who shall become so by election, shall pay ten dollars for the benefit of its funds, which shall entitle him to a diploma or certificate of membership.

ARTICLE VIII.—*Disposition of the Funds*

The funds of this Society may be appropriated at any time, in that way and manner, and for such purposes as the Society in its wisdom may deem expedient or necessary.

ARTICLE IX.—*Of the Distribution of the Effects of the Society in the Event of Its Dissolution*

SECTION 1. In case a dissolution of this Society shall at any time be proposed, a meeting shall be called specially for that purpose, and the consent of three-fourths of its members be required to effect it.

SEC. 2. Should the Society be dissolved by its own act, the property belonging to it shall be sold by order of the President, or by any three fellows who shall have authority from a majority of subscribing members, and the assets of the sale shall be equally divided among the above-mentioned members.

ARTICLE X.—*Of the Qualifications of Candidates Who Had Not Entered Upon Professional Practice*

SECTION 1. The candidate shall be at least twenty-one years of age, shall have a good English education, shall exhibit evidence of unexceptionable moral character, and shall have studied and practiced for the full term of two years with some practical dentist, known as such to this Society.

SEC. 2. No candidate for membership who can exhibit a diploma from a dental college, regularly chartered in any of the United States, shall be subject to an examination by the Examining Committee of this Society; but shall be entitled to his diploma, by becoming a member and subscribing to the constitution and complying with the by-laws.

ARTICLE XI.—*Of the Quorum, and Contingency of There Being No Quorum*

SECTION 1. Five acting members or fellows of this Society, shall, besides the President, be necessary for the transaction of any business at the opening of any annual meeting.

SEC. 2. In the event of a failure to procure a quorum at any regular meeting of the Society, the time of meeting on the following year shall be the time and the place, as on the preceding year.

ARTICLE XII.—*Of Alterations, Amendments, Etc. of the Constitution*

Any alteration, amendment, or revision of this constitution, may be made at any regular meeting of the Society, by joint assent of three-fourths of the fellows present at such meeting.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I.—*Of the Duties of Officers*

SECTION 1. It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings of the Society, when present; to sign the diplomas conferred on members during his term of office; to confer all honorary distinctions awarded by the Society, whether degrees of dental surgery, medals or other testimonials; and to draw upon the treasurer for all moneys appropriated by the Society.

SEC. 2. It shall be the duty of the Vice-President to preside at all meetings of the Society in the absence of the President, and to perform the other prescribed duties of the President, in case of his death, resignation, sickness or other disability.

SEC. 3. A President pro tem. shall be appointed to preside at any meeting when the President and Vice-President are both absent.

SEC. 4. It shall be the duty of the Recording Secretary, to note in a book kept for the purpose, all the proceedings of the Society, during the term of his office, and to furnish copies of any parts thereof, at the order of the President or his substitutes; and, also, to deliver the said book and proceedings to his successor in office. He shall also keep the seal of the Society, together with the copper-plate, from which diplomas, certificates, or degrees, are struck; also all the records belonging to the Society, designed to be preserved; and shall furthermore countersign all diplomas, and set the seal of the Society on all instruments requiring the same; he shall also notify every member of the

time and place of meeting of the Society, at least two months before the time of said meeting.

SEC. 5. It shall be the duty of the Corresponding Secretary, to conduct the domestic and foreign correspondence of the Society, in accordance with the advice of the President, or the express will of the Society communicated to him by the Recording Secretary, and at his own discretion, in cases of emergency, provided it does not interfere with any of the prescribed rules of the Society.

SEC. 6. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to keep all the moneys of the Society committed to his trust; to pay them over to the order of the President, countersigned by the Secretary, and to keep a correct account of the same in a book or books kept for that purpose.

SEC. 7. It shall be the duty of the Librarian to keep the books belonging to the Society's library; to obtain insurance on the same; and to take receipts of all persons who receive books from his hands by order of the Society; and in case of failure of the members receiving such book, to return it in twelve months, he shall forfeit and pay to the Society four times its price.

SEC. 8. It shall be the duty of the Executive, Examining and Publishing Committees, to examine the accounts of the Treasurer, and report the same to the Society at its annual meetings; to see that all the rules and regulations of the Society are duly enforced and executed; and it shall also be the duty of such committee, to inquire into the professional reputation and character of all candidates proposed, or who may apply for membership, and report the same to the Society which, being satisfactory, such candidates shall be balloted for, for admission into the same. It shall also be their duty to appoint a time and place, at least once in each year, for the examination of applicants for the degree of doctor of dental surgery; to examine such persons strictly and faithfully, in relation to their qualifications to enter upon the practice of the profession; and their certificate shall entitle the holder to receive the diploma of the Society conferring the degree of doctor of dental surgery. It shall also be their duty to superintend the printing and publishing of all books, tracts and other documents, issued by the Society.

ARTICLE II.—Of the Emoluments of Office

No officer shall receive any emolument unless in cases of special appropriation, excepting the Recording Secretary, whose duty it shall be to attend the meeting of the Society next subsequent to his election; and who shall be entitled to his traveling expenses and the sum of five dollars per diem during his necessary absence from business, in all cases where he is compelled to leave his place of residence.

ARTICLE III.—Of the Powers Vested in the Vice-President

The Vice-President may, if there be a sufficient number of the members of this Society residing in his immediate vicinity, convene them at any time, and when so convened, they shall have power to elect such officers from among their own number as may be necessary for the transaction of whatever business of a local nature may come before them; and it shall be obligatory on them to report their proceedings regularly at each annual meeting of the Society.

ARTICLE IV.—Of the Privileges of Members

SECTION 1. Each and every acting member, or fellow of the Society, shall be entitled to debate and vote on all questions agitated at any meeting thereof, agreeably to the by-laws and standing rules and regulations of the Society; and he shall moreover be eligible to any office in the gift of the Society, and, furthermore, he shall be entitled to a diploma, or degree of doctor of dental surgery.

SEC. 2. Each and every honorary member shall be entitled to a seat at all meetings of the Society; shall have the privilege of debating all questions not involving pecuniary expenditure; and shall receive the diploma, or degree of doctor of dental surgery, by paying therefor to the Treasurer of the Society the sum of ten dollars.

ARTICLE V.—Of the Appointment of Members to Certain Duties

SECTION 1. It shall be the business of the Society; at each annual meeting to appoint five of its members to prepare dissertations on some subjects connected with the profession; and also one member to deliver an opening address at the subsequent meeting.

SEC. 2. It shall moreover be the duty of the Society, from time to time to appoint certain individuals to prepare essays or any other documents ordered by the Society.

ARTICLE VI.—Of Awarding Premiums

SECTION 1. This Society may award premiums to members, for dissertations on subjects that may at any time be specified by the Society at an annual meeting; also, for important improvements in mechanical dentistry, and the manufacture of incorruptible teeth; and also for any other suitable object.

SEC. 2. The question of preference in all such cases shall be determined by the judgment of a special committee, appointed by the Society.

SEC. 3. Unsuccessful dissertations shall be at the disposal of their respective authors.

ARTICLE VII

SECTION 1. No member shall speak more than twice to any question, without express permission of the Society, and then only fifteen minutes at each time.

SEC. 2. Any member shall be liable to be called to order for personal recrimination of any other members, or for wandering in his remarks from the subject of debate.

ARTICLE VIII

These by-laws may be altered or amended at any annual meeting of this Society, by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.
