

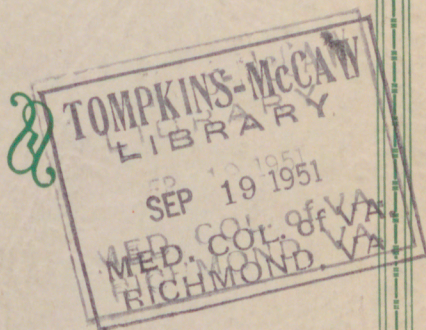

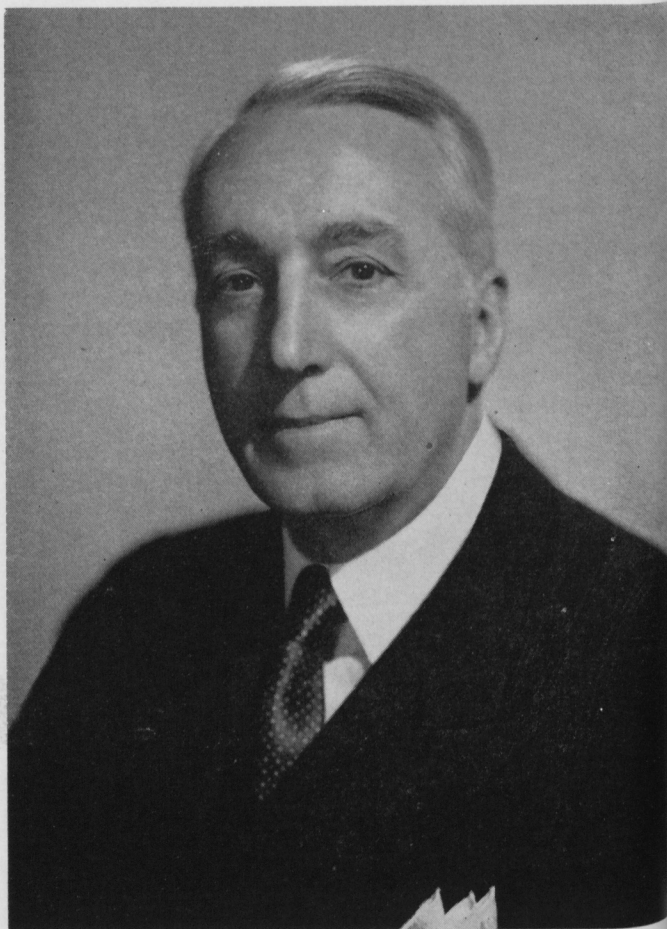

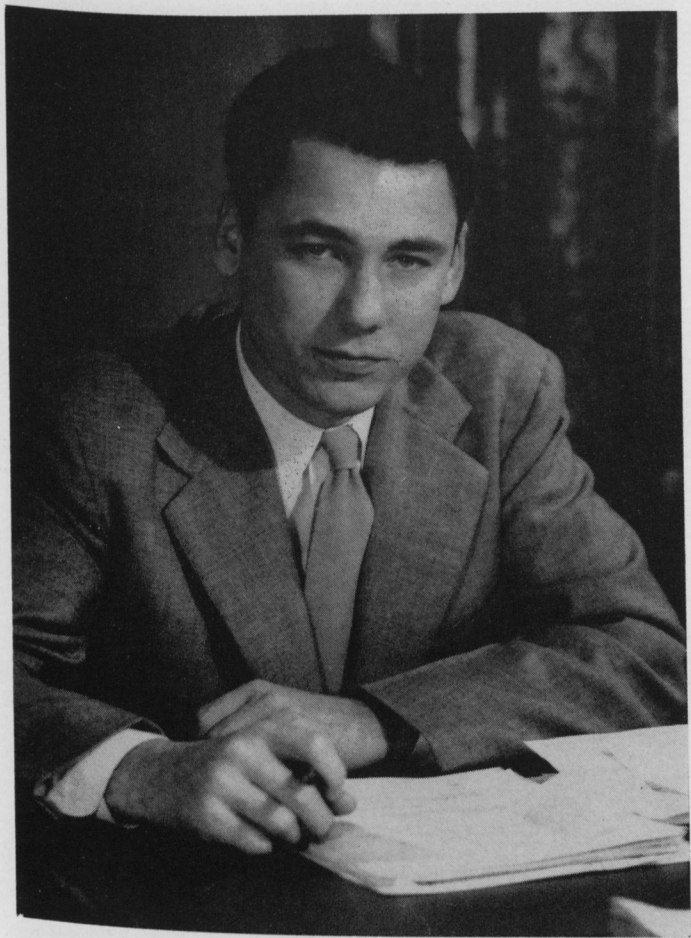

## "Fundamental Considerations in Partial Denture Construction."

### "Partial Denture Planning and Design."

ARTHUR R. FRECHETTE,  
D.D.S., F.A.C.D., Captain DC

#### Synopsis:

First lecture will discuss many of the basic factors involved in the construction of partial dentures. These will include examination and diagnosis, with special reference to maxillomandibular relations, physiological rest position and vertical dimension. The biological tolerance and response of oral tissues to the mechanical influence of the denture will also be considered. Emphasis will be placed on an analysis of the forces of mastication, with suggestions for suitable means of countering these forces. Color slides will be shown. Second lecture will amplify the content of the paper, "Fundamental Considerations in Partial Denture Construction," with a motion picture and slides to show the manner in which basis concepts are applied to practical cases. Special attention will be given to, mouth preparation and impression procedures, case planning with proper consideration of esthetics, retention, leverages and stress distribution, delivery, adjustment and maintenance problems.

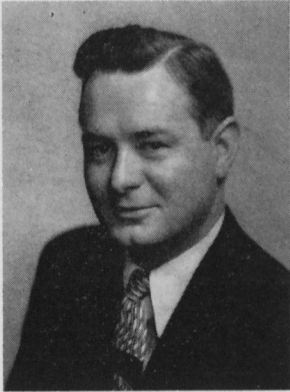

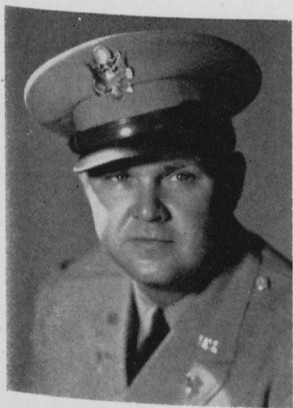

## **"Examination and Diagnosis of Edentulous Patients."**

PAUL A. MILLER, D.D.S., Washington, D. C. Chief of Prosthodontics, Walter Reed Army Hospital; Director of the Resident and Intern training program in Prosthodontics; Instructor in charge of the Department of Complete Denture Prosthesis, Army Medical Department Research and Graduate School; Director of the Walter Reed Dental Laboratory. Factors other than technical procedures must be recognized if one seeks to carry the treatment of Edentulous Patients to a successful conclusion.
